The Maryland Zoo

1 Safari Place | Druid Hill Park

The zoo is home to over 1,500 animals and while there, you might even get to feed a giraffe or be a part of the penguin encounter!

Canton Waterfront Park

3001 Boston Street | Canton

Attend a festival, grab a water taxi, or view the Korean War Memorial. This eight-acre park offers terrific views of the harbor and is a popular place for watching the Blue Angels Air Show.

Federal Hill Park

366 Warren Avenue | Federal Hill

Providing one of the best panoramic views of the Inner Harbor, Federal Hill is frequented by picnickers and star-gazers. This park features a basketball court and a gated playground area.

The National Aquarium

501 E. Pratt Street | Inner Harbor

Visit with the black tip reef sharks, check out the blue blubber jellies, and interact with stingrays in the touch pools.

Loch Raven Reservoir

Loch Raven

With miles of hiking trails through the woods and along the banks of the reservoir, this is a great destination for hikers and bikers alike.

Rawlings Conservatory & Botanic Gardens

3100 Swann Drive | Druid Hill Park

Nestled in Druid Hill Park, this building features five distinct greenhouse rooms, one half-acre garden with many flower beds, and a kaleidoscope of colors all year round.

Patterson Park

S. Linwood Street & Eastern Avenue | Canton

Picnic by the pagoda, take a walk around the lake, or rent a city scooter at the oldest park in Baltimore. Home to one of the two ice rinks available in the city.

Cylburn Arboretum

419 Greenspring Avenue | Roland Park

A 200-acre oasis in the city, a place of natural beauty and learning with hundreds of specimen trees and plantings, gorgeous gardens, wooded trails, and a historic mansion.

Druid Hill Park

900 Druid Park Lake Drive | Druid Hill Park

Go for a run around the reservoir, play a game of disc golf, or have a tennis match at one of the first large public parks in America. Well-known for the Druid Hill Reservoir and the Maryland Zoo.

Patapsco Valley State Park

8020 Baltimore National Pike | Patapsco Valley

Camping, canoeing, and fishing can all be done along this 32 mile stretch of the Patapsco River.
